## MURDERED BY A FOOTPAD

At 11 P. M. Saturday, May 17th, James Markham, a prominent employee at S. P. Co.'s Repair Shops, was stood up and shot here by an unknown footpad and died next day. Bullet is 38 caliber. When nearing Eighth and N Streets, Markham says he saw a short, light build young man coming along, wearing a Carnival mask, and when within a few feet distance this man presented a long barreled, nickel plated pistol and commanded Markham to throw up his hands. As it was at the close of the Street Fair Carnival, Markham treated the matter as a joke and walked away, when the murderous robber fired and fatally shot him and ran away at once. This man, certainly, is very inexperienced at "stick-up" work. He is evidently the same footpad who, three nights previous and in the same vicinity, attempted to hold up a boy named Dave McCullough. The boy ran and the robber fired a shot after him and ran away. He is described as a man about between twenty and thirty years old, 5 feet 4 inches to 5 feet 6 inches tall, about 130 to 140 pounds, short mustache, may now be smooth shaven, clothes looked dark at night, sack coat, black slouch hat. We do not know him, but luck or accident may reveal his identity to you. He may attempt to commit similar crimes in your city. Any information regarding his possible identity will be most thankfully received.

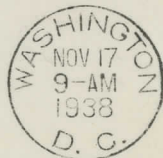

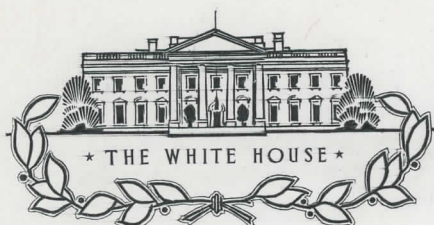

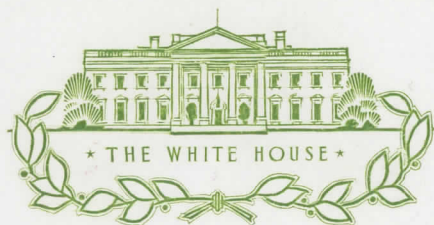

## Discovery of photo identifies farmhand on 2¢ Trans-Miss

More than 100 years have passed since the United States Post Office Department issued the original nine Trans-Mississippi commemorative-stamp set in 1898.

Across this great expanse of time comes new information that positively identifies an individual whose image appears prominent in the set's familiar 2¢ Farming in the

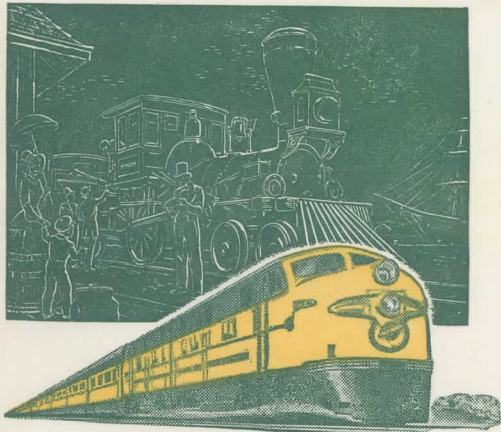
