1. Letters of inquiry must give number of pension certificate, and if writer is a widow or guardian, give name of deceased soldier. State Post-office address with COUNTY AND STATE.
2. Pension vouchers must be executed promptly when the quarterly instalments become due on the 4th of MARCH, JUNE, SEPTEMBER and DECEMBER and returned for payment, BUT NOT BEFORE DUE.
3. A certificate of a Clerk of Court of Record is required on all vouchers except those for quarterly payments.
4. The voucher cannot be executed without the presence of the pension certificate, which the officer must compare with, and correct the voucher if necessary, and carefully fill the blanks.
5. The name of pensioner must be signed as written in pension certificate.
6. Two witnesses WHO CAN WRITE must attest signature to voucher and one to receipts.
7. Do not fill receipts.
8. Use only good black ink.
9. If erasures, interlineations or alterations are made, the officer must certify over his official signature that they were made with knowledge and consent of affiant.
10. Voucher must be returned in large envelope.
11. A compliance with this circular will prevent delay in payment.

PENSIONS TO ALL

INCREASE PENSIONS.—Pension laws were made more liberal by the last Congress. Nearly every pensioner is now entitled to an Increase, including those who have obtained pensions within the last year.

All soldiers or sailors of the late war who were wounded, injured, ruptured, by accident or otherwise or contracted any disease, *however slight*, are entitled to Pension.

\$101,000,000 is the largest pension appropriation ever made by Congress. Colonel Dudley, ever true to the interests of his comrades, continues to call for an increase of the pension fund, and our just Government gladly responds, recognizing the fact that no money can pay the debt of gratitude due to the gallant "Boys in Blue," who in the time of their country's need left business, home and loved ones to fight for the Stars and Stripes. It is not charity you are asking. You have earned money enough by your services in the army to keep you in ease and comfort. The money is in the Treasury awaiting your call, and instead of toiling on with broken down health and constitutions trying to support yourselves and families, you should immediately send me your claims.

The widows or heirs of soldiers who died of disease or injury incurred while in the service, are entitled.

New Law relating to the Arrears Act and continuing it in force so far as Widows and Children are concerned:

NEW PAY AND BOUNTY LAW.

Under the provisions of the new Law, removing the charge of desertion, the soldier, or in case of Soldier's death, the heirs of such Soldier shall receive all pay and Bounty withheld on account of charge of desertion. Let all entitled under the provisions of the foregoing Acts send me their claims IMMEDIATELY, and I will speedily put them in possession of their dues.

New Law Paying for Horses and Equipments Lost in the Service. Your claim must be filed prior to January 9th, 1884, or you will be forever barred.

Every soldier should send me his discharge or a statement of his case and let me investigate it. If I think anything is due I will procure it for him, and if not send it back immediately and all it will cost him will be the postage.

Fill and return this blank and I will promptly put you in possession of whatever is due you from the Government. Write all answers with ink and in a plain hand. If a claim was ever filed before send me all papers pertaining to the case. Always send soldier's discharge if you have it. If not, let me procure you a duplicate, or if you were marked deserter let me have the charge removed.

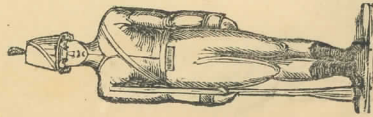

The Act of July 4, 1884, provides that the fee for the prosecution of a pension claim shall be \$10 only, unless a larger fee, not exceeding \$25, is agreed upon under a special written contract. The fee will be paid to the attorney, or other person entitled thereto, by the Pension Agent out of the pension allowed. Should the attorney or other person demand or receive for his services any greater compensation, he would subject himself to the penalties provided in the statute, as follows:

Any agent or attorney or other person instrumental in prosecuting any claim for pension or bounty land who shall directly or indirectly contract for, demand, or receive or retain any greater compensation for his services or instrumentality in prosecuting a claim for pension or bounty land than is herein provided, or for payment thereof at any other time or in any other manner than is herein provided, or who shall wrongfully withhold from a pensioner or claimant the whole or any part of the pension or claim allowed and due such pensioner or claimant, or the land-warrant issued to any such claimant, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall for every such offense be fined not exceeding \$500, or imprisoned at hard labor not exceeding two years, or both, in the discretion of the court.

THE PENSIONER SHOULD READ THIS.

1. Letters of enquiry and vouchers from Pensioners should not contain stamp for return postage; but stamps for the full amount of postage required should be placed on all matter addressed to the Agency or it will not be received. For reference to rolls give Pensioner's full name and number of Certificate.
2. Pension vouchers should be executed promptly when the quarterly installments become due on the 4th of MARCH, JUNE, SEPTEMBER and DECEMBER, and returned for payment but not before due.
3. Execute the voucher before a Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, or a Judge or Clerk of a Court of Record, or at the Agency. If before a Justice of the Peace or a Notary Public, the certificate of his official character and signature must be annexed to the voucher unless such a certificate has already been filed at this Agency.
4. Certificates intended for filing must be separate from voucher and show date of expiration of term of office.
5. Whenever the officer has an official seal he should affix it to the voucher.
6. The voucher cannot be executed without the presence of the pension certificate, which the officer must compare with and correct the voucher if necessary, and carefully fill the blanks. Excepting receipts.
7. The Pensioner's name must be signed to the voucher the same as written in pension certificate, if the certificate is correct, if not, it must be returned for correction.
8. The address written in the voucher should be the pensioner's true address, as the pension check will not be sent in care of another person.
9. Two witnesses [OTHER THAN MAGISTRATE] who can write, must attest signature to voucher and one to receipts. Christian names must be signed in full.
10. All changes or erasures made in the voucher should be certified to over the official signature of the officer before whom it is executed.
11. A compliance with these instructions will prevent delay in payment.
