THE FRANKLIN DELANO ROOSEVELT MEMORIAL SERIES OF 1945-46 AND ITS FIRST DAY COVERS

Franklin Delano Roosevelt was probably the most beloved modern president of any. He brought the nation through the Great Depression, worked with Congress to create numerous benefit and regulatory programs to protect the public in their working, commercial and personal lives and guided the nation through World War II. He died less than a month before complete victory in Europe and after setting in motion the victory over Japan. He was the only president to be reelected for a third term and then to a fourth term, all by landslide margins. As with Lincoln, people lined the route of the train that brought him to his rest to pay tribute to him.

This is a traditional first day cover exhibit for the series of four stamps issued in 1945 and 1946 (Scott Nos. 930-33) to memorialize President Roosevelt who died April 12, 1945. This exhibit shows the source of the portrait, photographic essays, the large die proofs, varieties and announcements. Stamp production of the four designs is followed by the first day covers and then by postal uses. There is a wide variety of cachets including hand painted or drawn, mounted cutouts and many World War II patriotic cachets used for first day covers. The postal uses show different domestic and foreign rates with many scarce to rare destinations and mixed frankings.

All four stamps use the same portrait. The one cent shows the family home in Hyde Park, NY. The two cent has a vacation home in Warm Springs, GA, where the thermal baths helped in his therapy for polio. The three cent has the White House and the five cent his Four Freedoms quotation.





PLEASE NOTE: All covers are machine cancelled unless stated otherwise. Emphasis is placed on full set cachets and combination covers with complete sets cancelled on the 5 cent first day. In order to show hand painted only known types, patriotics and others not listed in Mellone, a few common Mellone listed cachets have been omitted.

Some covers show their poor quality World War II era condition with aged paper, cover gum stains and "browning" from sulphited card stuffers which varied by cachet maker and paper stock. This is normal for the period.

Red dots show significant items. Blue dots show other important items. Section headings at top left are in bold print.










