Fairfax Co. Va Nov 1860

Dear sister
I receive a kind letter
from you and was glad
to hear from you and that
all of you well. I am
quite well & now we have
moved since I wrote to
you last Friday we
started from Camp Chase
about noon we marched
about four and we get there
about four clock and we try

there about one hour and then
we marched about four miles
and went on picket duty
and ^{we} stay there about twenty
four and then we went in
to camp when we went we
took in two ~~for~~ men that
we did not know they were
they are a great battle
out to Bull Run the 2 Regt
is in it I have see Horace
Whitefield he is well and
is in this battle I expect
he for when I was here
he was march that way
you said that Mrs Coby
wont to where ~~is~~ Frank
is here and he is well he
has not been sick since
he come out here,

we expect to stay here
all winter you if you
~~to~~ can now you may send
me a box of stuff you
send some butter and some
cake and some ~~kind~~
cand peper and what
else you are a mind to
you tell Farther not
to buy that pasture
with out a good head
of it you tell
Mother that I am
as coming home in
the spring to her new
paper she has get you
tell Seymour to be a
Good boy till I come home
I get a paper form you
you tell Seymour to

to write to me and you
give my love to all
of the folk and tell
them to write I dont
now as I can write a
great deal more I must
draw my to a close by
say bye
