Washington, D.C.
March 1st 1864

dear friends at home I sit
down this morning to let you
know where I am and that
I am well and enjoying good
health and hoping that
these few lines will find
you the same. I am at
Washington now but I expect
to stay over night to night
in camp Stoneman 18 miles
from this place. I left
Selmira Saturday morning
last I got to Philadelphia
Sunday morning about 3 o'clock

and about 4 I left there
we run about 8 miles then
the old engine run off the
track stoveing 8 cars to
pieces but so hapend that
they were freight cars so
that no one was hurt.

I am now in camp Stoneman
and it is raining just like
fun you see that I began
this letter in Washington I
was writing this morning
when we was called out
to march up here we had got
about 4 miles when it began
to rain and the mud is
full 4 inches deep we stoped
an have to rest when we
got about half way.
you see a large lot of up
near the top there is where
I left off at Washington

now I will send a few
lines to rock & Ellen
rock you must take care
of your self and be
carefull and not get your
self in the scrape that
I am in I tell you
that this is a darned
hard place but I am
contented here but I
should not be if I
had no mates but I
have lots of them so
that I hante bin home
sick any much.

Mother pleas give my best
respects to all the girls
around home there

Washington D.C. March 1st 1864

Dear friends at home I sit down this morning to let you know where I am and that I am well and enjoying good health and hoping that these few lines will find you the same. I am at Washington now but I expect to stay over night to night in camp stoneman 18 miles from this place. I left elmira Saturday morn ing last I got to piladelphia Sunday morning about 3 oclock and about 4 I left there We3 are about 8 miles then the old engine run off the track stoveing 8 c ars to pieces but so hapend that they war freight cars so tthat no one was hurt. I am now in camp stoneman and it is raining just like fun you see that I began this letter in Washington I was a writing this morning when we was called out to march up here we had got about 4 miles when it bewgan to rain and the mud is full 4 inches deep we stoped an hour to rest wen we got about half Way. You see a large dot up neer the top there is where I left off at Washington. Now I will send a few lines to rock elen you must take care of your self and be carefull and not get your self in the scrape that I am in I tell you htat this is a darned hard place but I am contented here but I should not bee if I had no mates but I have lots of them so that I hante bin home sick any mjuch....yours truly George M.
