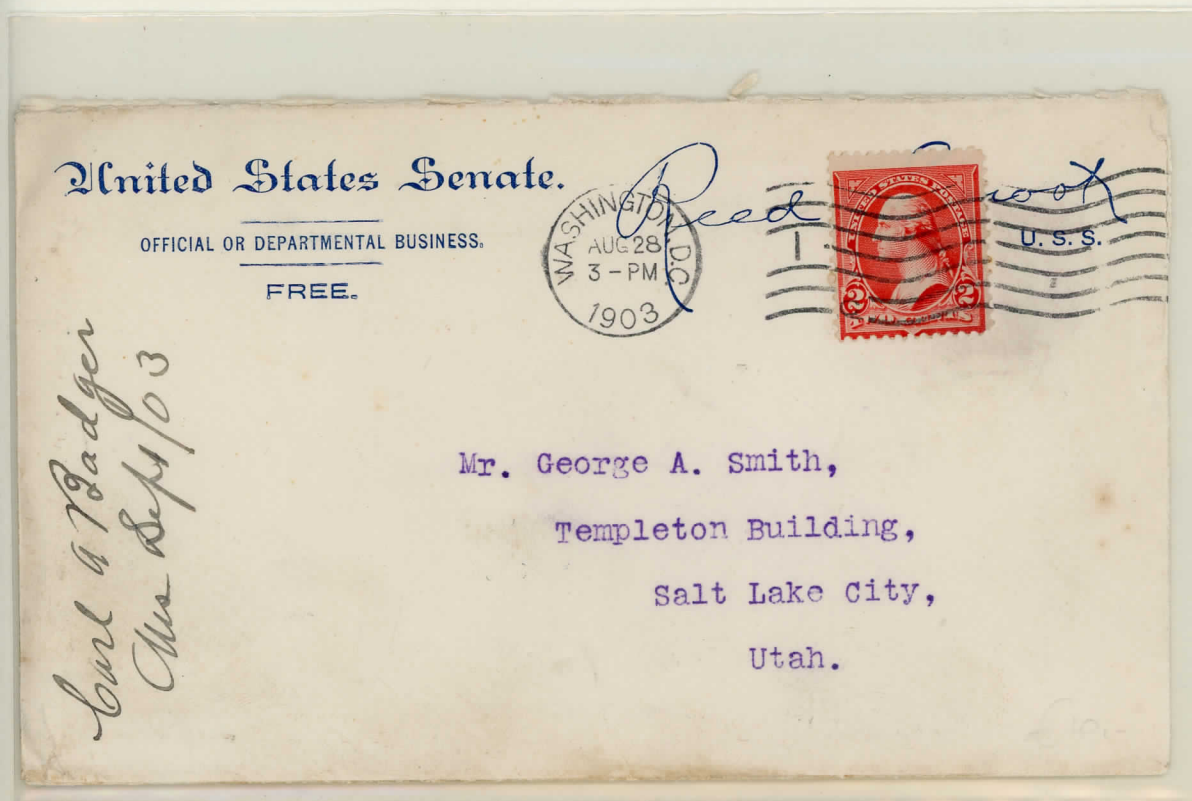
SMOOT, Reed, a Senator from Utah; born in Salt Lake City, Utah, January 10, 1862; moved with his parents to Provo, Utah County, Utah, in 1874; attended local schools and academies and graduated from the Brigham Young Academy (now Brigham Young University) at Provo in 1879; engaged in banking, mining, livestock raising, and in the manufacture of woolen goods; elected as a Republican to the United States Senate in 1902; reelected in 1908, 1914, 1920 and 1926 and served from

March 4, 1903, to March 3, 1933; unsuccessful candidate for reelection in 1932; chairman, Committee on Patents (Sixtieth Congress), Committee on Printing (Sixty-first and Sixty-second Congresses), Committee on Public Lands (Sixty-second and Sixty-third Congresses), Committee on Expenditures in the War Department (Sixty-third through Sixty-fifth Congresses), Committee on Public Lands and Surveys (Sixty-seventh Congress), Committee on Finance (Sixty-eighth through Seventy-first Congresses); co-author of the Smoot-Hawley Tariff Act of 1930; moved to Salt Lake City, Utah, in 1933; retired from active business pursuits; served as one of the twelve apostles of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and at the time of his death was next in line to succeed the president of the quorum and to succeed the president; died in St. Petersburg, Fla., January 9, 1941; interment in Provo City Cemetery, Provo, Utah.

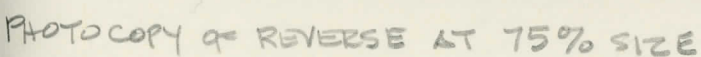
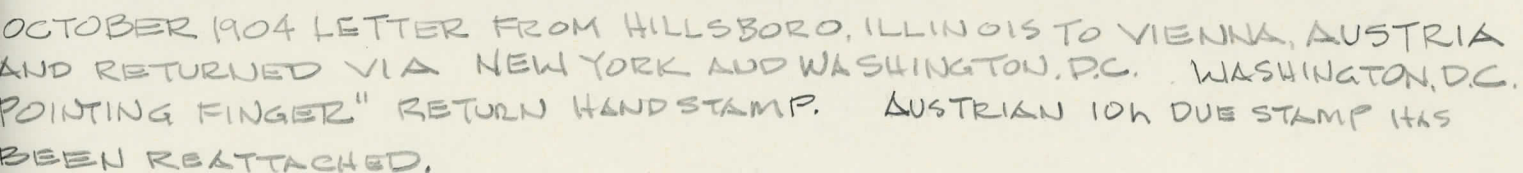

LETTER POSTED A WEEK BEFORE ALL MAIL SERVICE TO GERMANY WAS SUSPENDED.



OVER FOR MORE OF THE STORY...

This is a very interesting cover as it was sent to Germany just as America entered the Great War against Germany. Posted at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on 31 March 1917 at 7 PM, which was a Saturday evening. On the following Monday, 2 April, President Woodrow Wilson requested Congress declare war on Germany; which Congress did on Friday the 6th of April. Some time in early June 1917 the cover was officially sealed, stamped with a pointing finger "Return to Sender From D. D. L.", and postmarked June 1917 (the day did not print) with the machine slogan "DO YOUR BIT BUY A LIBERTY LOAN BOND INQUIRE AT ANY BANK OR POST OFFICE" from Washington, D. C. The die for the slogan is Robert Payne's die b which has a last known use date of 15 June 1917. What happen to the letter in between is a mystery.

The cover is franked with two 1-cent green Washington-Franklin's (Scott No. 462) which was the United States domestic postage rate at the time. However, at this time there was a negotiated treaty rate with Germany that provide for the transmissions of first class letters between the United State and Germany at the domestic rate when the mail was carried on German ships traveling directly to German ports. In March 1915 with the war well underway in Europe and feelings against Germany strong, German ships were banned from U. S. ports. With no German ships available this route and consequently this rate was suspended. Mail to Germany could still be sent but now it had to go at the UPU rate of 5 cents and via another country. Letters paying the suspended rate of 2 cents were to be treated as short paid and marked with a "T" and postage due of double the deficiency. This cover has not been marked in this manner. So what happened?

Another possibility is the two 1-cent Washington-Franklin's pays the 2 cents merchandise sample rate for up to 4 ounces. The sender, Morgan, Hastings and Co. was a manufacturer of gold foil and of dental gold; the addressee was a doctor, possibly a dentist. Such merchandise had to be clearly labeled and enclosed in an unsealed wrapper. The envelope flap is missing and there is no sign of gum residue that would indicate that this cover was sealed. A sample of gold foil could easily have fitted in this envelope.

On Saturday, 7 April 1917, the Post Office Department issued order #211 which prohibited all mail to Germany. It further instructed Postmasters to send the prohibited mail to the Division of Dead Letters, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. This cover probably went from Philadelphia to New York on 31 March 1917 where it was held until instructions were received as a declaration of war was widely expected. Once Order 211 was received the letter would have been stamped "Mail services suspended to country addressed." and forwarded to the Division of Dead Letters in Washington, D. C. There it would have been opened, the flap and contents removed, and the envelope officially sealed. If it contained a gold foil sample, that sample would likely have been confiscated. Passing gold, even in small amounts, to the enemy in time of war is not likely to be tolerated.

What a confusing explanation this is for a letter that got caught in a turning point of history which was very confusing at the time nor when looked back upon.

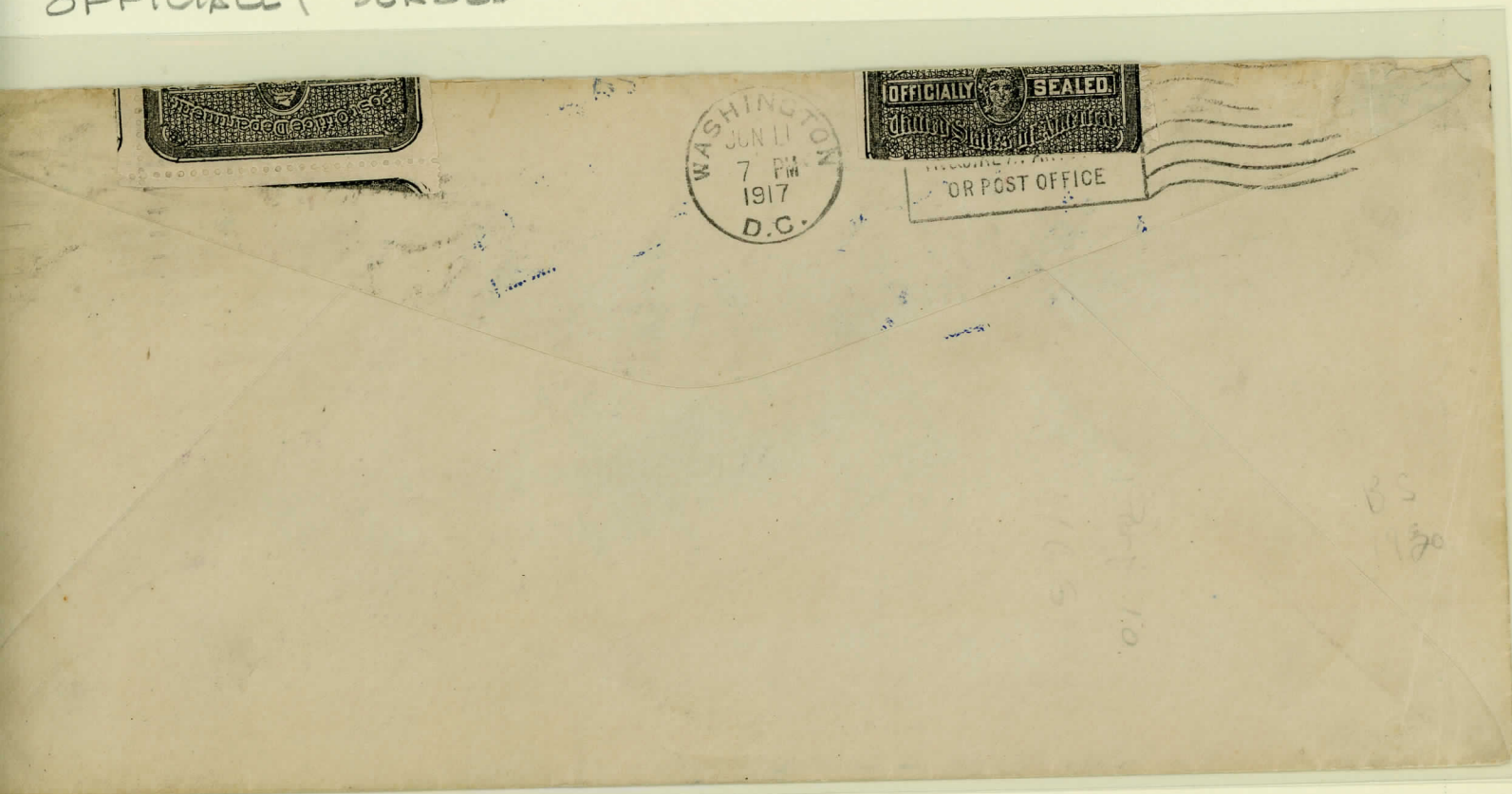

Scott 462 (2) tied to the upper right corner of cover by a black "PHILADELPHIA, PA MAR 31 7 - PM 1917" machine cancel and paying either the 1 cent per two ounces printed matter rate for up to 4 ounces or the 2c merchandise sample rate for the first 4 ounces. Magenta two line "Mail service suspended to country addressed." auxiliary mark in the middle. Blue printed three line "Morgan, Hastings and Co. 817-21 Filbert Street Philadelphia" corner card to which a violet pointing hand containing "Returned to Writer FROM D.D.L." is pointed. Scott OX15 affixed over the top and tied by a partial black Washington D.C. JUN PM 1917 slogan cancel - "DO YOUR BIT BUY A LIBERTY LOAN BOND INQUIRE AT ANY BANK OF POST OFFICE". No back flap, although it appears it was tucked in as there is no gum residue or sealing outline of same. Wawrukiewicz and Beecher (Anthony S. & Henry W. - U.S. International Postal Rates, 1872-1996) provides the following: "PB 13115 (Apr. 7, 1917) No mail to be sent to Germany or any place under German control." This must have still been in the system by that time and was returned sometime in June. Perkal and Kazman (Adam & Seymour - The Post Office Seals of the U.S.) list the earliest know use of OX15 as 24-Apr-1917, making this a fairly early use. Since a return address was provided I can't explain the trip to the Dead Letter Office. There was a provision in the 1913 P.L.&R, Section 481 1/2, as amended by Order No. 431, 16-Jun-1917 stating the following: "Every letter, writing, circular, postal card, picture, print, engraving, photograph newspaper, pamphlet, book or other publication, matter, or thing, of any kind in violation of any of the provisions of this act (Act of June 15, 1917 Espionage Bill), Is hereby declared to be nonmailable matter and shall not be conveyed in the mails or delivered from any post office or by any letter carrier : Provided, That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to authorize any person other than an employee of the Dead Letter Office, duly authorized thereto, or other person upon a search warrant authorized by law, to open any letter not addressed to himself. (Act of June 15, 1917, Sec. 1, Title XII." It seems a back door, and perhaps intentional method of allowing an employee of the Dead Letter Office to search the mails. Thought provoking cover!
